

# A WORLD PREMIERE

A character-driven comedy-drama in which eight disparate (and desperate) characters, all in the twilight years of their theatre careers, are unexpectedly 'rescued' from whatever happens to discarded, elderly actors. The why is what the play is about ..... and how at the end they 'rescue' themselves. It is set in the present and in the lounge of an old boarding-house somewhere in Ellerslie, yet to be discovered by Auckland property developers; in need of attention but comfortable.

The NZ playwright, Ruth Mayo, now lives in London but is an ex-Mercury actor from the 1970s to early 80s; she knows her territory well.





## WITCHERY

Goodies and baddies ride again! In a series of seamlessly linked vignettes, with memorable cameo moments speckled throughout, it is challenging to pinpoint unique contributors. Director Daryl melded all into a delightful but cogent evening of fluid, faultless entertainment.

Dorren handled fiendishly difficult costume demands and accent challenges to command the stage as dominatrix of the coven, while her spectacularly lurid acolytes provided a background of contrasting, constantly mobile visual treats.


Grandmother Pam, who could be my granny any day, provided delicate wisdom and gravitas throughout.

## AGM PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Held on 16 April 2018. Committee and officers were elected as follows:

Life Member: Desley Simpson was recognised for her unwavering support as Patron of the society for six years.

#### Extract from the report presented by Anna Adam—President 2017:

As both Production Manager and President I thank the numerous volunteers who spent hours throughout the year – researching, reading, programming and sourcing the performance rights for the plays; sourcing and making wardrobe and props; building and painting the sets; feeding, watering and catering for the cast, crew and audience; stocking the bar; coordinating the helpers for hospitality; selling the tickets, handling the accounts; directing the actors who appeared on the stage; supporting the director; designing the stage; dressing the set; lighting the set; designing and programming the cues to light the set and punctuate the story with appropriate sound; managing the show; coordinating the techs and stage crew, designing and putting the programme together; taking photographs and recordings; reviewing the plays and writing the newsletters; stuffing envelopes; putting up the billboards; and to those who support the theatre in whatever capacity is required. Phew. Making theatre really is a communal experience.

**Budgets & Expenditure**: ETS received four grants in 2017 and reduced rent rates set by the Ōrākei Local Board. There was a grant of \$3000 from Foundation North to cover the purchase of a new sound board and a grant of \$3000 from the Ōrākei Local Board towards publicity costs.

**Publicity & Marketing:** The spend on this makes up approximately 25% of our theatre production expenses, 30% if you were to add in the newsletter costs. It covers printing the Play Guide, flyers and billboards for each play and the audition notices. Despite our expenses, our audience numbers are still decreasing, and I think it would be a good time to trial other methods of publicity. While trying to balance a frugal budget the old adage comes to mind that you can't sell a secret and we need to take this risk to spread the word better.

Keep this date - ETS is planning to host the **2019 Tasters Night** again this year and the theatre has been booked for three rehearsal evenings with the presentation being held on **Saturday the 24<sup>th</sup> of November 2018**.

**Venue:** We often fantasise about ETS owning its own purpose-built premises or expanding the current facilities to obtain more storage space. It would be good to house all our materials in one place and we have a meeting scheduled with the Strategic Broker, Ōrākei for the Auckland Council, to discuss our needs (and dreams) for the current venue and another more pressing matter. A recent rent review has increased the amount to a level we cannot afford and this matter needs to be resolved quickly if the society is to continue producing plays.

**Summary:** Ellerslie Theatrical Society Inc. continues to be very healthy. Financially we managed to break even over the 2017 financial year, we have good working and contingency capital, productions are on track and the number of volunteers is growing with each play. Thank you to everyone involved with the productions, support and management of the society in 2017, you are our community and without you Ellerslie, and indeed the entire Ōrākei ward, would not have a theatre. Now there's just a small matter of the venue to address.

BEAUTIFUL THING is an urban fairytale set on the landing walkway in front of three flats on a working class South East London council estate called Thamesmead, and tells the heart-warming story of two young men coming to grips with their sexuality and the effect it has on the people in their lives.

Jamie lives with his solo mum Sandra, while Ste lives with his drug dealing abusive brother and his alcoholic father next door. After Ste gets a beating from his brother one night, Sandra invites Ste to stay at their flat. Sleeping top to tail in the same bed, Jamie realizes that he is attracted to Ste. As Ste spends more and more time with Jamie, they find themselves drawn together...

A story about all the intense feelings of the first time you fall in love in an often humorous, tough and tender way. Contains coarse language, drug use, sexual and adult themes.

Bruce Brown is a graduate from UNITEC's Performing Arts Bachelor programme. He's been involved as both a writer and director with Short+Sweet Auckland and has directed several productions with Ellerslie Theatrical Society including Shakespeare's THE WINTER'S TALE, April Phillips' MOTEL and Terry Johnson's THE GRADUATE. In 2016 he premiered his first solo Basement Theatre show HOOK-UP BOYS to sell-out audiences. He's also the creator and artistic director behind the successful LEGACY PROJECT, now in its fifth year. Most Friday nights he can be found hanging out with friends playing an assortment of board games (but mainly Killer Bunnies) and obsessively watching Steven Universe.
